Context/ Background	<p>Children's Health Ireland (CHI) is leading on the clinical and operational transformation of acute paediatric healthcare and consists of hospitals at Crumlin, Temple Street and Tallaght. The three children's hospitals and CHI's office transitioned from four separate, independently governed entities into one new single organisation effective on 1st January 2019 to govern and operate paediatric services in Dublin.</p> <p>This new organisation will operate as a single service across the existing locations of Crumlin, Temple Street, Tallaght and the CHI office before transitioning to the new facilities at the two paediatric outpatient and urgent care centres at Connolly and Tallaght Hospitals and the new children's hospital on the campus shared with St James's Hospital.</p> <p>The Minister for Health appointed a new Board in September 2017, initially on an administrative basis to support CHI's Chief Executive and management team in the planning and implementation of the Children's Hospital Programme and to prepare for the transition of services from the existing three children's hospitals under the governance of the legally established Board, which commenced on 1st January 2019.</p> <p>Children's Health Ireland Programme is a major programme of work led by CHI, focused on transformative service change to enhance services for children and young people, to integrate the three existing hospitals, while maintaining existing and new services, ensuring patient safety and quality until transition is complete. It will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Operationalise an integrated acute paediatric healthcare network



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Act as client for the government funded capital project to build the new children's hospital and the two paediatric outpatient and urgent care centres at Connolly and Tallaght Hospitals, and a separately funded research and innovation centre • Act as client to a major ICT programme to digitize paediatric healthcare • Commission, transition to and operate the new children's hospitals and the two paediatric outpatient and urgent care centres. <p>The new children's hospital will be at the centre of a new model of care with two new Paediatric Outpatients and Urgent Care Centres (OPD & UCCs) central to the delivery of this new model of care. The POPD & UCCs will be based at Connolly Hospital on the North side of Dublin (due to open Summer 2019) and one at Tallaght Hospital on the South side of Dublin (due to open 2020). The addition of the new OPD & UCC, together with the opening of the new hospital in time, will transform how healthcare is delivered to children in Ireland.</p>

<p>Purpose of the Role</p>	<p>The post holder will discharge the duties of a Clinical Specialist Physiotherapist.</p>
<p>Principal Duties and Responsibilities</p>	<p>Professional Duties and Responsibilities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overarching responsibility for and leadership of the MSK Physiotherapy team in CHI at Temple Street (MSK team comprises of Orthopaedics / MSK, Complex Spine, Rheumatology, Plastics & Craniofacial clinical areas) • To assess and treat patients referred for physiotherapy in a way that demonstrates advanced clinical reasoning and knowledge • To demonstrate evidence based practice through the process of clinical reasoning and decision making and applying it to complex cases



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- To participate in the wider Musculoskeletal/Orthopaedic Service, including development of care pathways for specific pathologies and particular groups of patients
- To represent the MSK team within the Physiotherapy Department
- Clinical caseload- capacity & complexity appropriate to grade - in MSK Orthopaedics in settings including OP, inpatient, Day Ward, ED.
- Responsible for the effective management of the physiotherapy MSK Orthopaedic waiting list in line with agreed targets- including oversight/guidance of any waiting list management of areas of responsibility (Rheumatology, Complex Spine, Plastics & Craniofacial)
- Provision of clinical support, advice, teaching and training for the physiotherapy department to promote clinically effective MSK orthopaedic physiotherapy intervention including the weekend in patient MSK services
- Undertake clinical supervision and contribute to competency evaluation of Senior and Staff Grade physiotherapists, delivering MSK Orthopaedic services in TSCUH
- Engage in performance appraisal and PDP with the Physiotherapy Manager.
- Engage in and seek clinical supervision arrangements suitable to underpin own clinical specialist grade clinical practice – peer, mentorship etc.
- Participate in the education and supervision of physiotherapy assistants, students and other professional and ancillary staff as required
- The development, management and evaluation (annually) of the musculoskeletal service provided in accordance with professional standards and in consultation and by agreement with the manager or his/her deputy
- Conduct, lead and influence single discipline and multidisciplinary research and audit projects
- To advise and support changes in work practices and procedures in keeping with best practice developments in musculoskeletal orthopaedic physiotherapy
- To participate in senior and staff grade mentoring and development and to be a resource for senior and staff grade physiotherapists in the areas of planning, service development and service evaluation
- Participation in the Physiotherapy 'Out of Hours' service
- Planning of integrated cross site MSK / Orthopaedic Services as part of CHI.
- To engage with national initiatives and as a tertiary hospital Paediatric Clinical Specialist lead on engagement and clinical guidance for colleagues nationally

Duration of post	This is a permanent role.
Remuneration	Remuneration is in accordance with the salary scale approved by the Department of Health: Current salary scale with effect from 1st April 2019: [Grade, Code 3707]. Rising in increments annually from point 1: €57,701 to €66,957 incl. LSIs).
Annual Leave	Annual Leave entitlement is 30 days per annum
Working Week	<p>The hours allocated to this post are 37 with 7.4 hours as a standard working day. The allocation of these hours will be at the discretion of the Department Head and in accordance with the needs of the service.</p> <p>HSE Circular 003-2009 "Matching Working Patterns to Service Needs (Extended Working Day / Week Arrangements); Framework for Implementation of Clause 30.4 of Towards 2016" applies. Under the terms of this circular, all new entrants and staff appointed to promotional posts from Dec 16th 2008 will be required to work agreed roster / on call arrangements as advised by their line manager.
