

We encourage members to get involved and engaged in election activities but there are canvassing rules that must be followed to ensure a transparent and fair election.

GUIDELINES ON CANVASSING DURING THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS TO COUNCIL

- 1. All members of the Society, including the candidates seeking election, voters and officials involved in the ballot, must comply with all regulations governing the election and relating to canvassing.
- 2. Canvassing for candidates is acceptable where it is with their agreement.
- Candidates should campaign through the positive promotion of their candidacy, and not through negative campaigning, including personal comments, about other candidates.
- 4. In order to satisfy election regulations, surveys conducted before or during an election to elicit further information from the candidates, either in writing or by telephone, must ensure:
 - (a) all candidates seeking election are contacted
 - (b) all candidates are asked the same questions
 - (c) all candidates have the opportunity to see and edit their replies before publication
 - (d) no specific recommendation is made by any group following such a survey
 - (e) the source of funding for the survey must be clearly identified in advance and be from a particular group
 - (f) proof of the source of funding must be divulged on the request of the Scrutineer/Chief Executive.
- 5. CSP funding cannot be used to carry out canvassing or to conduct questionnaires and surveys on behalf of individual candidates or specific groups.
- 6. No NHS or other employer's resources should be used for campaigning or publication of election material without their permission.
- 7. No candidate should be the subject of any discrimination for any reason including age, gender, colour, sexual orientation or political affiliation.
- 8. Any suspected infringement of these guidelines should be notified to the Chief Executive and the Official Scrutineer.
